International Volunteer Day (for economic and social development) or better known as IVD is celebrated on the 5th of December every year. It is a day to celebrate volunteerism and offers a platform for volunteer-involving organisations and individual volunteers to promote volunteerism, encourage governments to support volunteer efforts and most importantly to recognise volunteers' contributions to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goals, locally or internationally.

IVD was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 12th December 1985. To-date, United Nations Volunteer Program has recorded the following estimates pertaining to volunteer work force:

- 109.0m of full time workers
- 30% of volunteering takes place formally through organisations, associations and groups
- 70% occurs through informal engagements
- 60% of the informal volunteers are female

This edition of the newsletter is filled with news on volunteering activities that have been carried out by various organisations in collaboration with the foundations, throughout the second half of 2019. We shall focus on the four of the events coordinated by the foundations, namely, 'The Global Volunteering Programme with UITM', 'West Region Scouts' Edu-Volunteering Programme', 'Mercedes Benz Malaysia's EPIC CSR Activity' and 'Community Outreach Programme' with USM.



The Global Volunteering Programme with UITM

With the theme, Global Volunteering Program: Emergent Prospect of Cognitive Development Among Orang Asli at Belum Temengor in Early Childhood Education and Orangutan Rehabilitation: Conserving Their Home and Our Home, the Office of International Affairs, Universiti Teknologi Mara (UITM) together with Yayasan EMKAY and Pulau Banding Foundation has had various discussions on the programme since February 2019.

The event which took place at Pulau Banding and Orang Utan Island, both located in Perak from the 4th to the 10th of July 2019, witnessed the involvement of 44 students from the USA, UK, China and Malaysia. The students/volunteers from the Southern Connecticut State University (SCSU), USA, Liverpool John Moores University (LJMU), UK, Shanghai Normal University (SHNU), China and Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) gathered at UiTM on the first day of the programme to be given detailed briefing on what to expect and the do's and the don't while on the programme.

The group was briefed by Puan Hjh Zainon Kasim, CEO of Yayasan EMKAY on the uniqueness of the Belum-Temengor area, and the focus of the foundations' programmes in the area. They were blown away by the photos of the area that they will be visiting and were excited to learn about the 'works' they are tasked to perform. Upon arrival at the Belum Rainforest Resort, the participants were again reminded of their respective tasks at the two orang Asli villages, Kampung Sungai Tiang, Royal Belum and Kampung Semelor, Temengor.

The trip to Kg Sg Tiang, Royal Belum was an adventurous one for the volunteers, as they were transported by boat for an hour and on foot for another 30 minutes to reach the school in the village. During the visit to the Kg Sg Tiang Primary school, the volunteers carried out talks on nutrients and good eating, organised "Fun with English" activities and reading and singing lessons with the school children. A friendly football match was also organised, after the students introduced the foreigners to durians and other local fruits.

In Kampung Semelor, Temengor, the volunteers visited the *i-play* Toy Library and had an English singing session with the children. The volunteers then proceed to work together to complete a therapy garden project and carry out landscaping activities with the guidance of Mohamed Khairul Hamzah the Aborist of Belum Rainforest Resort.

"Coming to Malaysia I had a pretty good idea of what I wanted to do career wise. However this has been flipped on its head. I'm still absolutely mad about animals, but now I'm mad about rainforests too. Leaving Malaysia was definitely mixed emotions, excitement to see my family but with a dark cloud hanging over me knowing I wouldn't be waking up everyday excited to explore and see my new friends faces everyday, I guess I now feel a bit homesick for Malaysia so I know I'll be back someday!"

Apart from volunteering to complete the tasks assigned, whilst in Pulau Banding, the volunteers took the opportunity to explore the 130 million years old rainforest by participating in a night walk exploration. It was a thrilling adventure as they were able to see some of the night creatures while being told forest stories by Fakhrurazi, the Recreation Guide. Some of the creatures that the group were opportune to see were the Malayan Pit Viper (snake), the luminous frog, giant ants, scorpion and spiders. They also learnt about some wild herb such as the wild ginger, "Tongkat Ali" and "Kacip Fatimah".

They enjoyed the activities that were arranged for them in the rainforest during their four day stay in Pulau Banding.

The learning process and the volunteering works continue at the Orang Utan Island, Bukit Merah for the next three days. Besides completing their tasks; preparing food for the orangutans, cleaning of the cage and the surrounding area as well as painting, they were also briefed in detail on the research and conservation effort undertaken by the Bukit Merah Orang Utan Island Foundation.



West Region Scouts', Scotland, Edu-Volunteerism Programme

'Be prepared'! - the Scouts' motto. The aborigine community of Kg Semelor, a secluded area in Temengor, is all that when they welcomed a group of fifty six Scouts members, all the way from Scotland. The group, consisting of teenagers and their Scouts' leaders were on a mission to offer assistance in constructing some facilities for the villagers' use. It was part of the West Region's 'Skills for Life' Programme which aimed to equipping their young members with skills that they will someday need.

The team arrived in Malaysia on the July 14, 2019. Led by their leader, Mr John Kitson, the team spent nine days working in the scorching heat to build an adventure play park for the children. The young Scouts also constructed a table especially for the local Headsman, for purposes of displaying his traditional handicraft products. The community hall in the village was also cleaned and coated with fresh paint, with alphabets painted on the walls complete with a fantastic Jungle Book mural.

Various fruit trees including durian, mango, cempedak and pulasan were planted on a waste plot that was cleared, giving way to a new agricultural land. Ladies' fingers and red spinach seeds were also planted in parts of the vegetable plot. All in all, the team did a good job.

The villagers went all out to entertain their guests on the last day, as a show of appreciation by performing the 'sewang dance'. The Toy Library children also performed a traditional dance, dressed in their colourful traditional costumes. It was a treat for the locals to see men in skirt (kilts) during the closing ceremony function hosted by the Headsman, Tok Samad Jeranggong.

As the saying goes, "all work and no play make Jack a dull boy". After all the hard work put in, the group were treated to a much needed

They left behind their memories through the things they built and the generous gifts of books, clothing, stationeries, make-up kits and other knick-knacks that were donated to the villagers.

Mercedes Benz Malaysia's EPIC CSR Activity

"Unfulfilled", - the perfect word to describe the feelings of the volunteers of the first Mercedes-Benz Malaysia (MBM) EPIC CRS programme in Belum-Temengor, back in December 2018.

Therefore, in July 2019, they return to Belum-Temengor to continue with their CSR initiative in the Belum-Temengor Rainforest area. EPIC MBM volunteers expanded their CSR activities to Sekolah Kebangsaan Sungai Tiang, Royal Belum this time around. In 2018, the team organised the same programme at SK RPS Banun, in Temengor. The aim is to create a conducive recreation and play space for the students of the school.

Initial discussions of the 'EPIC CSR Royal Belum 2.0' programme begun in February 2019 and from then on, detailed planning for the setting up of the "Teratak Ilmu Ta'pong" at SK Sungai Tiang school library has been carried out until its implementation in July, 2019. The Teratak Ilmu Ta'pong is named after the late Headsmen in Kg Sungai Tiang; who was absolutely respected and was a person who put importance on the education of the children of the indigineous peoples.

The low water levels of the Temengor Lake posed a challenge to the volunteers as they had to resort to carrying the equipment, buckets of paints and furniture for about one kilometre from the riverbank when the boats were not able to go any further without getting stuck in the mud.

Within six (6) hours, the volunteers, together with the Yayasan EMKAY team managed to transform the gloomy looking resource centre into a cheerful and conducive environment for the students. The sea blue paint coupled with new furniture and special areas allocated to board games and music further enhanced the calm and cosy atmosphere of "Teratak Ilmu Ta'pong".

The MBM volunteering works did not stop just at Kampung Sungai Tiang, Belum. They went on to complete the painting works of the higher part of the community hall at Kampung Semelor, Temengor which was not able to be completed by the Scouts, earlier in the month.

In Kampung Semelor, MBM team also welcomed villagers with a special menu of Nasi Hujan Panas (Rainbow Ghee Rice) prepared by another team of YE volunteers. Village headsman, Samad Jeranggong took this opportunity to treat the volunteers with a sumptuous feast of durians from the trees in Kampung Semelor.

Community Engagement Programme by School of Distance Learning, University Sains Malaysia

A group of thirty volunteers comprising of faculty members and students of the School of Distance Learning, USM took part in a community engagement programme in Kg Desa Damai. The group was divided into three teams, to carry out works identified by the YE team, ie. spring cleaning of the Toy Library, cleaning of the surau and painting of the workshop.

As it was normally done, each year end, the toy libraries will undergo a spring cleaning process, where the toys and furniture are scrubbed clean and disinfected. The broken toys are sent for repair or replaced, and the reading materials, workbooks and stationeries be replenished. The walls are also cleaned from dirt and grime and rid of cob webs and dust. This is in preparation for the new school term to begin.

The team tasked with cleaning of the surau, dusted, swept and mopped the floors, walls and window panes. The mats and cloth used for praying are washed and put under the sun to air and dry. The books, kitabs and Quran were rearranged to make a new systematic stack of reading materials.

Upon completion of their tasks, these two teams went to assist the third group, who is responsible to coat a new paint and draw an innovative mural on the walls of the Skills Workshop. The team was tasked to paint according to a concept requested by the trainers of the programme conducted in the building. Works however stopped due to heavy rain around midday. The team tried to complete the work after lunch, but due to time constraint they had to leave the village as they needed to leave the village before dark. Upon the departure of the team, the local youths came in to complete the painting of the mural till late in the evening.

4 August 2019 - It is an annual event for Yayasan EMKAY to conduct education development programmes for the the Belum-Temengor Orang Asli children. These activities are conducted either through the respective schools or through the i-play Toy Libraries. To add to the excitement of this year's programme, a Bahasa Malaysia and Mathematics Camp encompassing a trip to Kuala Lumpur had been organised. The programme was held from the 2nd to 4th August, which is the foundation's way of rewarding twenty eight SK RPS Banun students and four i-play Toy Library alumni for their academic achievements throughout the year.

The camp was conducted at two main venues; the Premiera Hotel where the students also resided throughout the duration of the camp, under the guidance of Puan Hajah Nornisa Sahid, Coordinator of Yayasan EMKAY's Education Development of Belum-Temengor Programmes and Wisma Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka (WDBP). The programme at WDBS was a collaboration programme with the Bahagian Pengembangan Bahasa Kebangsaan Pelbagai Kaum of Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka (DBP).

The sessions conducted throughout the programme was a way to attract the attention of the students towards the Bahasa Malaysia and Mathematics subject using the 'learning through play' approach while revising the topics previously learnt at school.

At WDBP, the students were excited with the games arranged by the officers' in-charge. Among the games that took place were 'Dam Ajaib' (Giant snake and ladder) and a puppet show. Amidst all these, famous patriotic songs were also sung in between the games.

In conjunction with 2019's Belum-Temengor education theme 'Eco-education' at all the i-play Toy Libraries, the students visited the Aquaria KLCC and the KL Bird Park where they got to see for themselves the various types of aquatic animals and birds.

With August being the National Day month, the students were also treated to a visit to the National Monument and Merdeka Square to teach them about the meaning and importance of patriotism. Before leaving for home, they were taken to see Malaysia's first tiles mural named 'Cara Hidup di Malaya dan Bahasa Kebangsaan' (The way of life in Malaya and the National Language) which was completed in 1961. They learnt that after fifty three years, the restoration works of this mural which began in May 2014 was completed in December 2016. The students were able to take many memorable photos with this historical mural as the background.

PROGRAM PEMBANGUNAN PENDIDIKAN BELUM-TEMENGOR 2019

Yayasan EMKAY seperti tahun-tahun sebelumnya menjalankan pelbagai Program Pembangunan Pendidikan di Kawasan Belum Temengor sama ada di peringkat sekolah atau melalui program di Perpustakaan Permainan 'i-play' (PPip). Sebagai program tambahan bagi tahun 2019 serta atas tiket imbuhan kepada 28 pelajar SK RPS Banun serta 4 Alumni PPip yang menunjukkan peningkatan prestasi yang menggalakkan, Yayasan EMKAY telah menganjurkan Kem Bahasa Melayu dan Matematik serta Lawatan Sambil Belajar ke Kuala Lumpur pada 2 hingga 4 Ogos 2019.

Sesi Kem Bahasa Melayu dan Matematik telah dijalankan di dua lokasi berbeza iaitu di Hotel Premiera Kuala Lumpur di bawah kendalian Puan Hjh Nornisa Sahid, Penyelaras Program Pendidikan Yayasan EMKAY di Belum-Temengor. Lokasi kedua adalah di Wisma Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka, Kuala Lumpur yang melibatkan kerjasama Bahagian Pengembangan Bahasa Kepelbagaian Kaum Dewan Bahasa dan Pustaka (DBP).

Sesi-sesi yang dijalankan sebenarnya adalah merupakan sesi ulangkaji yang bertujuan untuk menarik minat para pelajar terhadap mata pelajaran tersebut dengan menggunakan pendekatan 'belajar melalui bermain'. Di DBP pula, para peserta amat teruja beraktiviti dengan para pegawai bertugas melalui permainan 'Dam Ajaib' dan terhibur dengan Persembahan Boneka, ditambah pula dengan selingan lagu-lagu rakyat yang sememangnya malar segar di ingatan mereka.

Bertepatan dengan tema Pendidikan Eko atau 'Eco-education' di kesemua PPip di kawasan Belum-Temengor pada tahun ini, para pelajar dibawa ke Aquaria KLCC dan KL Bird Park serta ke beberapa tempat bersejarah seperti Dataran Merdeka dan Tugu Negara bagi menyemai semangat patriotisme dan bersesuaian dengan sambutan hari kemerdekaan ke-62 pada tahun ini.

Sebelum berangkat pulang, para peserta dibawa menyaksikan mural jubin pertama di Malaysia yang disiapkan pada tahun 1961, bertajuk 'Cara Hidup di Malaya dan Bahasa Kebangsaan'. Mereka juga belajar bahawa selepas 53 tahun, kerja-kerja pemuliharaan mural ini telah dilaksanakan mulai Mei 2014 dan siap sepenuhnya pada Disember 2016. Di hari tersebut, para pelajar sempat merakam gambar kenangan berlatarbelakangkan mural bersejarah ini

ABORIGINE CHILDREN'S ARTWORK DISPLAYED AT SHAH ALAM GALLERY

7-25 October 2019 – The Creative Art Studio in collaboration with Yayasan EMKAY once again hosted this year's Children's Visual Art Exhibition with the theme 'Bicara Tuan Muda' (Voices of the youth). The creative arts by the children of the i-play Toy Library of Kampung Desa Damai, Temengor were highlighted and displayed at the Shah Alam Gallery. The event also displayed the paintings of children from other Arts and Creative Kindergarten and other kindergarten or organisations from around Klang Valley.

Yayasan EMKAY's involvement in the Children's Visual Art Exhibition began in 2018. This first involvement has seen the creative arts of the aboriginal children of the Jahai tribe from Kampung Sungai Kejar, Royal Belum being hand picked and displayed during the exhibition. The event has succeeded in highlighting the creative works of the Jahai tribe who have been left behind in formal education.

Seeing the children's interest toward arts and crafts, this year, children of the Temiar tribe from Kampung Desa Damai, Temengor were chosen and taught on the basic concepts of drawing, colouring and sketching to the point that they were able to draw on canvas and subsequently produce 19 creative works to be presented at this year's exhibition.

KE ARAH PELAKSANAAN PENTAULIAHAN KEMAHIRAN UNTUK MASYARAKAT ORANG ASLI

Peribahasa 'kalau tidak dipecahkan ruyung, manakan dapat sagunya' adalah ungkapan yang tepat atas usaha Jabatan Tenaga Kerja Negeri Perak (JTK) dan Yayasan EMKAY sejak tujuh (7) tahun lalu dalam memperkenalkan program latihan kemahiran (jahitan) khusus untuk wanita Orang Asli di Kawasan Belum-Temengor. Hasil daripada program tersebut, kini sekumpulan wanita dari Kampung Semelor, telah mampu menjana pendapatan untuk keluarga, hasil dari jualan produk jahitan, mahupun tempahan jahitan yang diterima.

Jika pada 2012 yang lalu, sekumpulan wanita Orang Asli dari Kampung Semelor, Temengor mula menjinakkan diri dalam dunia jahitan di bawah pokok rambutan, di Kampung Sungai Tiang, Belum pula, sekumpulan wanita telah mula berlatih di rumah salah seorang penduduk kampung sejak tahun 2016. Berkat iltizam mereka serta disokong kuat oleh Penghulu Kampung masing-masing, ditambah pula dengan kerjasama pelbagai pihak seperti JTK dan JAKOA, golongan wanita ini kini meneruskan program jahitan mereka di dalam bangunan yang lebih kondusif yang dibangunkan oleh Yayasan EMKAY.

Yayasan EMKAY dengan sinergi tersebut terus mempergiat program-program yang menjurus kepada pengupayaan masyarakat Orang Asli Belum-Temengor. Yakin dengan sokongan penuh daripada agensi-agensi berkaitan, kumpulan wanita ini terus berlatih dan berkarya sehingga kini layak untuk mendapat pengiktirafan (pensijilan) di atas pencapaian di dalam melalui program ini.

Seiring dengan usaha tersebut, Yayasan EMKAY telah menerima kunjungan lawatan kerja oleh YB Dato' Mahfuz Omar, Timbalan Menteri Kementerian Sumber Manusia serta YBrs. 27 August 2019 - Bukit Merah Orang Utan Island (BMOUI) is often the preferred location for organisations from various countries looking for exchange of knowledge on primates and veterinary care. Recently, the delegation from Seoul Grand Park, Korea had visited the island in hopes of forming a formal collaboration on the orangutans. The delegation was led by Dr Bo-sook Kim, Seoul Zoo Management Division Director, Seoul Grand Park.

The Seoul Grand Park encompasses themed botanical gardens, campsites, a contemporary art museum, a theme park and a zoo, all in one. First opened in 1984, today, it holds 2,700 animals from 332 species from all over the world, and has 29 animal farms which sits on a 2,420 km² land.

During Dr Bo-sook's visit, the delegates toured the island and was briefed on the operations, conservation concepts, education and research programmes and veterinary services dedicated to the orangutans.

The programmes and conservation efforts undertaken by BMOUI had clearly captured the hearts of the delegates. They were truly impressed and Dr Bo-sook Kim herself had expressed her desire for the Seoul Grand Park Zoo to form a joint venture with BMOUI in the near future to protect this special species.

ORANG UTAN ISLAND FURTHER CEMENTS MALAYSIA AS THE SCIENTIFIC REFERRAL CENTRE

10 November 2019 – Since their first visit to the island on 27 August 2019, the team from the Seoul Grand Park Zoo of Korea, (SGPZ) has initiated a collaboration with BMOUIF to explore and establish a mutually beneficial platform, with exchange of expertise and scientific personnel, in the spheres of veterinary medicine and wildlife conservation.

A little over two months later, they came back with a Memorandum of Understanding to be signed with BMOUIF. On 10 November 2019, the MOU for facilitating of research works, education and veterinary care of the orangutans was signed on the island.

In the opening address by Prof. Emeritus Dato' Dr Abdul Latiff Mohammad, Chairman of Bukit Merah Orang Utan Island Foundation (BMOUIF), which was delivered by fellow Board Member Prof. Dr. Badrul Munir Md Zin, he said, "Since its inception in 2000, Orang Utan Island has progressed from being a sanctuary, where visitors experienced first-hand awareness and education on the orangutan, to a globally recognised ex-situ conservation facility and referral centre for the endangered Bornean orangutan".

"On behalf of Seoul Grand Park and Seoul Grand Park Zoo, I am truly delighted that we have inked a collaboration with Bukit Merah Orang Utan Island Foundation, which is renowned around the world as playing a critical role in building conservation capacity in aspects of primatology such as primate behaviour and ecology, captive care and veterinary medicine, and, conservation biology", stated Chun-hun Song, the Director-General of Seoul Grand Park.

BMOUIF's Founder, YBhg Tan Sri Datuk Hj Mustapha Kamal bin Hj Abu Bakar continued, "In the 18 years of its operation, Orang Utan Island has achieved success and on demand for its activities and programmes, attracting interest from, among others, universities from within Malaysia and around the world, for joint-cooperation across fields in the wider scope of conservation biology".

Among guests from South Korea in attendance were Dr Bo-sook Kim (Director of Zoo Management Division, Seoul Grand Park), Dr Yong-gu Yeo (Director of Conservation Research Division, Seoul Grand Park) and Dr Woo-jin Song (Curator of Population Management, Seoul Grand Park).

Also present to grace the occasion were the BMOUIF Board of Trustees, officials from the Wildlife Department, Department of Veterinary Service, Taiping Zoo, Kemaman Zoo, Malacca Zoo, corporate bodies, along with postgraduate internship students.

This MoU is expected to raise the curtains for more collaboration between tertiary institutions in South Korea and BMOUIF, as the knowledge and the expertise that can be harnessed from joint programmes will be invaluable in the future of conservation biology, especially in the Far East.

Among the universities and higher educational institutions BMOUIF has collaborated with, include, Monash University, University of Cambridge, University of Victoria (Canada), Kyoto University, Universiti Sains Malaysia, University Malaysia Sabah, Universiti Malaya, Universiti Putra Malaysia, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Cyberjaya University, Maktab Rendah Sains Mara (Penang), and, Raffles College (Singapore).

Malaysia has an immense pool of scientific talent in the area of conservation biology, and collaborations such as this, between BMOUIF and SGPZ, is further testament as to how Malaysia can export scientific knowledge and expertise around the world.

BANGUNAN BARU UNTUK PULAU ORANG UTAN

17 Ogos 2019 - Tragedi Disember 2018 telah memusnahkan sebahagian bangunan di Pulau Orang Utan. Usaha pengumpulan dana bagi membaikpulih bangunan yang terbakar telah dijalankan sejak Disember 2019 dan kerja-kerja pembaikpulihan telah dijalankan dari 1 April sehingga 31 Julai 2019.

Bangunan baru ini telah dirasmikan oleh YBhg Tan Sri Datuk Dr Hj Mustapha Kamal bin Hj Abu Bakar, pengasas Yayasan Pulau Orang Utan Bukit Merah. Detik bersejarah ini telah dimulakan dengan bacaan doa selamat oleh saudara Azrul bin Jamaludin dan diteruskan dengan pemotongan reben sebagai simbolik perasmian bangunan baru tersebut oleh tetamu kehormat dan disaksikan oleh para pegawai Yayasan Pulau Orang Utan Bukit Merah.

Pembinaan bangunan baru telah membolehkan pihak pengurusan membuat pelan lantai baru yang lebih sistematik. Susun atur bangunan dan penggunaan konkrit untuk menggantikan kayu dan papan pada bangunan asal telah dilaksanakan, dengan mengekalkan konsep asalnya iaitu konsep terbuka (tanpa dinding). Konsep ini membolehkan pengunjung yang berkunjung ke Pulau Orang Utan menikmati keindahan persekitaran semulajadi hutan dan tasik di sekeliling bangunan ini.

Selain itu, terdapat juga kemudahan –kemudahan yang disediakan untuk keselesaan pengunjung di sini iaitu surau, Lakeside Cafe, bilik tayangan, kedai cenderahati 'Orangutan De Shoppe' dan ruang menunggu bot yang berhawa dingin.

Surau

Surau ini dibina khas untuk memenuhi keperluan pengunjung Muslim yang datang ke sini terutamanya pengunjung dari Timur Tengah. Atas permintaan mereka sebelum ini, pihak YPOUBM berusaha memberikan yang terbaik dengan menyediakan kemudahan yang diperlukan. Surau ini dilengkapi dengan kipas, tempat berwuduk serta keperluan untuk solat.

Lakeside Café

Lakeside Café di Pulau Orang Utan terletak di tengah laluan yang menghubungkan pejabat pentadbiran dan jeti pelepasan. Tempatnya yang

strategik menarik pengunjung yang melalui café ini untuk singgah menikmati minuman sejuk atau ais krim sementara menunggu bot untuk pulang.

Café ini memberikan pengalaman unik kepada pengunjung, di mana mereka boleh memilih sama ada mahukan pemandangan tasik di sebelah kiri atau pemandangan hutan di sebelah kanan. Tempat duduk di sebelah kiri café akan membolehkan mereka melihat bot-bot nelayan yang melalui kawasan ini sambil menghirup udara segar. Selain itu, tempat duduk mengadap hutan juga tidak mengecewakan kerana pengunjung dapat melihat aksi orangutan dari jarak jauh dan juga binatang-binatang lain yang hidup liar di kawasan ini seperti burung-burung, kera dan juga luntung. Café yang berkonsepkan santai dan terbuka ini menyajikan minuman dan makanan ringan kepada pengunjung yang datang ke Pulau Orang Utan.



Sebagai kenangan lawatan ke Pulau Orang Utan, De Shoppe menawarkan barangan cenderamata seperti penanda buku, magnet peti sejuk, poskad, buku khas terbitan Pulau Orang Utan Bukit Merah, t-shirt pelbagai warna dan juga barangan berunsurkan kebudayan di Malaysia seperti kain batik dan Baju Kurung Kedah.




