UiTM Visit to Belum Temengor & Pulau Banding



In the ambitious UiTM Research Expedition to Belum Temengor and Pulau Banding, unfolding from October 25 to October 27, 2023, a dedicated cadre of over 20 researchers from Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) Shah Alam embarked on a profound journey. This expedition, beyond its academic pursuits, was driven by a dual purpose — to engage with indigenous communities and delve into their narratives on safety, experiences, and potential threats, while simultaneously fostering authentic connections with the unique cultural tapestry of the region.

More than a conventional research venture, this expedition embodied UiTM's commitment to a holistic and responsible approach. The researchers, armed with scholarly intent, approached their work with a spirit of empathy, recognizing the significance of contributing to sustainable development and the preservation of cultural heritage. This nuanced blend of academia and humanitarian outreach underscored the UiTM Research Expedition as a transformative experience, poised to make a lasting positive impact on the lives of the indigenous communities residing in the pristine landscapes of Belum Temengor and Pulau Banding.



Upon arrival, the researchers commenced their mission by preparing food bags for distribution to those in need. Following this act of kindness, the team enjoyed lunch before heading to the dock, where a safety briefing preceded their boat journey to Kampung Klewang, one of the indigenous villages. Upon arrival, interviews with the locals commenced, focusing on their safety, experiences, and any perceived threats. The day concluded with the distribution of food bags, ensuring a positive impact on the community.

The second day saw the UiTM researchers heading to RPS Banun with a convoy of eight four-wheel vehicles. Their destination was Kampung Semelor, renowned for its cleanliness. Before conducting interviews, the team met with the Village Chief, establishing a connection with the community. Interviews were then carried out in indigenous houses, providing valuable insights. Subsequently, the researchers visited RPS Banun School, engaging in activities with both students and teachers. The day concluded with the distribution of prizes to students, fostering a sense of appreciation and encouragement.

On the final day, the researchers visited UMK-TRaCE to delve into the history of Pulau Banding and its surrounding areas. A journey through the discovery walk was followed by a seminar room briefing, offering an in-depth understanding of the region's rich history. As this enlightening session concluded, the research group bid farewell to Pulau Banding, concluding their visit. The journey back to UiTM Shah Alam marked the end of a fruitful and enlightening expedition.

The UiTM research expedition to Belum Temengor and Pulau Banding proved to be a comprehensive endeavor, encompassing interviews with indigenous communities, community engagement, and a historical exploration of the region. The researchers' commitment to understanding and contributing to the well-being of the indigenous people exemplifies UiTM's dedication to meaningful research and community involvement. The knowledge gained from this expedition is expected to contribute significantly to future research and community development initiatives

SDSN Asia Pacific Solution Forum




he inaugural Asia-Pacific Solutions Forum (APSF) was held by SDSN on November 2, 2023, at the Sunway Resort Hotel in Sunway City, Malaysia. The focus of the event was "Accelerating Local Action for the SDGs in the Asia-Pacific." The APSF highlights important facilitators as well as obstacles to sustainable development in the Asia-Pacific region. Drawing inspiration from SDSN's previous four Global Solutions Forums, the APSF presents creative, scalable, reproducible, and research-backed solutions that have been found among SDSN members and local business partners. This seminar and discussion come at a pivotal moment as we approach the halfway point of Agenda 2030 and as the COVID-19 pandemic has impeded progress towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). There were 140 people present at the event, including CSOs, academics, government officials, and business executives.

The forum commenced with remarks from Prof. Woo Wing Thye, Vice-President of Asia, SDSN, and Research Professor at Sunway University; Tan Sri Sir Jeffrey Cheah KBE AO FASc, Founder and Chairman of the Sunway Group; and Steven Sim, Deputy Minister of Finance II of Malaysia.

Six presentations of solutions and a few quick questions from the feedback panel came next.
