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The Secret Life of *Rafflesia*



Rafflesia is a genus of parasitic flowering plants. There are approximately 28 species, (including four incompletely characterized species as recognized by Willem Meijer in 1997) all found in Southeast Asia, mainly in Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and the Philippines. The genus *Rafflesia* is named after Sir Stamford Raffles, the adventurer and founder of the British colony of Singapore. He was the leader of the Indonesian Rainforest expedition team, which is said to have found the first *Rafflesia* flower, in 1818.

The plant has no stems, leaves nor roots. It is a holoparasite to its host, which is a vine, in the genus *Tetrastigma* (belonging to the Vitaceae family). It spreads its absorptive organ, the haustorium, inside the tissue of the vine. The only part of the plant that is visible outside the host vine is the five-petalled flower.

Interestingly enough, the *Rafflesia* only releases a foul odour (like that of decaying flesh) during blooming to attract insects such as flies, which in turn will transport pollen from the male to the female flowers. Little is known about how seed dispersal occurs. However, tree shrews and other forest mammals eat the fruits and presumably disperse the seeds.

Belum Temengor Rainforest Complex



Belum Temengor Rainforest Complex is an important *Rafflesia* conservation area because this is the only area in Peninsular Malaysia that has three species of *Rafflesia* reported.

They are among the most threatened plants in existence, mainly due to their limited seeds dispersal agents and the destructive activities such as illegal logging. Over use of *Rafflesia sp.* spotting have also resulted in the death of the vines upon which they thrive. While physical development is needed for the advancement of a civilization, there should however, be a balanced approach to the development and the conservation and protection of nature which involves the protection and conservation of animal species and plants.

Realising this critical issue, Pulau Banding Foundation has taken a positive step towards conservation of *Rafflesia* in Belum Temengor. An ex-situ project was established to conserve the species and further understand the rehabilitation potential of the plant.





This project is divided into two stages. The first stage is in the planting of the *Tetrastigma sp.* Vine. *Rafflesia* being a holoparasitic plant requires this particular vine to grow and establish itself. The research team has planted this host vine (*Tetrastigma sp.*) in the Belum Discovery Centre at Pulau Banding. The first cultivation of the host plant started on March 30, 2018 upon written approval from the state forestry department.

The second stage is *Tetrastigma sp.* stem grafting. Grafting is a horticulture process whereby the tissue of an individual plant is grafted to another plant of the same species. Upon successful union, both individuals will continue their growth together as one plant. Hence, in this project, once the vines start to grow healthily, stem cuttings containing *Rafflesia* spores that have formed earlier will be grafted to this healthy growing vine at the Discovery Centre. This is important to ensure that the *Rafflesia* seeds germinate successfully within a shorter period of time.

This vine of *Tetrastigma sp.* needs to be healthy and growing profusely because the source of nutrients to produce *Rafflesia* flowers is entirely dependent on the host. Other than that, the humidity, temperature, weather and soil conditions also play a major role in determining the rate of growth of host vines.

YAYASAN EMKAY'S UPSR PROGRAMME FOR 2018

In 2018, Yayasan EMKAY, for the third consecutive year has organized, the 'Sowing the Seeds of Success' Programme – a programme to prepare students for the UPSR exam – simultaneously in Perak, Selangor and Pulau Langkawi, Kedah. In general, this programme is a combination of a variety of specialized modules aimed to provide students with a 'fun learning' experience while preparing for the exam.

A total of 531 students from five (5) schools participated in this programme. At the beginning of the programme (March 2018), only 187 students pass their first term test, while 337 were categorized as 'galus' (combination of Fail/Pass result). Of this group of 337 students, 68 were classified as having 'serious problems'; ie. failing all subjects (6E), either because they did not master the basic 3M (writing, reading, counting) or due to skipping school.


This year's programme includes additional and tuition classes at the respective schools with the support of the school teachers as well as sessions with facilitators who are expert in all the subjects; motivational and intensive camps with focus on techniques for answering questions; and contribution of instructional aid to the schools.

Yayasan EMKAY also sought support from external facilitators to motivate the students, as part of the programme. The Intensive Camp where the facilitators shared techniques and tips in answering questions received good response from not just the students but from the teaching faculty as well.

To maintain the level of excitement while studying, students together with their mentors, were also given the freedom to choose their own "out of class" learning method which is most effective for each of them from a list of options derived from the mentors' creativity.

The mentors are mainly Volunteers (comprising of staff from the EMKAY Group and M K Land Holdings Bhd) who provide guidance to the students during preparation, including identifying problems faced by them and finding ways to solve them. The volunteers also go the extra mile in taking the time to get acquainted with the families of students to understand their background and receive their 'mentees' at their own homes on weekends, as 'adopted children'.

UPSR Programme for 2018 Student Achievement



A new "out-of-the-box" programme was introduced to students in Langkawi this year; a programme known as the 'Kepung' Programme. In collaboration with the Kuala Melaka Inn (KMI) and their staff as volunteers, 42 of the weakest students were housed in the hotel for two months until the end of the UPSR exam. During that time, students performance are monitored and their attendance in school ensured. Additional classes were conducted by appointed teachers and their leisure time was spent with activities that are geared for their success as well as to help build confidence and self-esteem.

The presence of the students at the resort even attracted the attention of the Prime Minister of Malaysia, Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad and his wife, Tun Dr Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali, during their visit to Langkawi on 4th July 2018. Both Tuns were briefed of the programme aimed at helping the students of SK Kuala Melaka and SK Padang Mat Sirat to pass the examination. The Tuns also spent time advising students to diligently study and convinced them that knowledge is 'a weapon in every struggle'.

On 29th November 2018, on the day the results were announced, the programme recorded an increase of 81.8% in the 'Pass' category (an increase to 340 from the previous 187 students in the early stage of the programme). Meanwhile, the number of students who are in the 'Fail' category decreased by 54.6% (184 from the previous 337). The Alor Pongsu and Kg Jawa 2 schools achieved their target of no failures in all six subjects.

From our analysis, we found that English and Mathematics are two subjects which require special attention, as the average failure rate is more than 20%.

PROGRAM UPSR 2018 ANJURAN YAYASAN EMKAY

Di tahun 2018, buat kali ketiga berturut-turut Yayasan EMKAY telah menganjurkan Program 'Menyemai Benih Kejayaan', yakni satu program untuk menyediakan para pelajar yang akan menduduki Ujian Pencapaian Sekolah Rendah (UPSR) di beberapa sekolah secara serentak. Secara amnya program ini adalah gabungan pelbagai program khusus untuk memberikan pengalaman 'keseronokan sambil belajar' kepada para pelajar sepanjang membuat persediaan untuk peperiksaan.

Seramai 531 orang pelajar dari lima (5) buah sekolah telah menyertai program UPSR 2018 ini. Di peringkat awal (Mac 2018), hanya seramai 187 pelajar telah dikategorikan sebagai tidak bermasaalah, sementara 337 orang lagi dikategorikan sebagai Galus (Gagal/Lulus). Dari kumpulan seramai 337 orang ini pula, 68 orang pelajar diklasifikasi sebagai mempunyai 'masalah serius', yakni gagal semua mata pelajaran (6E), sama ada kerana tidak menguasai 3M (menulis, membaca, mengira) ataupun masalah ponteng.

Pengisian program tahun ini termasuklah sesi kelas tambahan dan tuisyen di sekolah, dengan sokongan dari guru-guru sekolah, mahupun pakar-pakar di dalam semua subjek, sesi kem motivasi dan kem intensif/tips menjawab soalan, dan sumbangan bantuan alat mengajar kepada pihak sekolah.

Yayasan EMKAY turut membariskan pakar-pakar untuk memberikan motivasi kepada para pelajar, sebagai program sampingan. Kem-Kem Intensif dan Tips Menjawab Soalan juga seringkali mendapat sambutan yang baik dari keseluruhan warga sekolah.

Untuk mengekalkan elemen keseronokan sambil belajar, para pelajar bersama mentor masing-masing diberi peluang untuk memilih sendiri cara belajar luar bilik darjah yang paling berkesan bagi diri mereka, mengikut kreativiti mentor. Para mentor adalah Sukarelawan (terdiri daripada kakitangan kumpulan EMKAY dan M K Land Holdings Berhad) yang membimbing para

pelajar semasa membuat persediaan, termasuk mengenal pasti masalah yang dihadapi pelajar, dan mencari jalan untuk menyelesaiannya. Sukarelawan turut meluangkan masa untuk berkenalan dengan lebih rapat dengan keluarga para pelajar untuk memahami latar belakang kehidupan di samping menerima kehadiran 'mentee' di rumah masing-masing pada hujung minggu, sebagai 'anak angkat'.

Satu program baru yang diperkenalkan kepada para pelajar di Langkawi tahun ini, ialah Program 'Kepung' di mana, dengan kerjasama pihak Kuala Melaka Inn (KMI), dengan kakitangannya sebagai Sukarelawan, program ini telah menempatkan seramai 42 orang pelajar lemah di hotel ini selama dua bulan, sehingga tamat UPSR. Sepanjang tinggal di KMI, para pelajar dipastikan hadir ke sekolah, termasuk juga kelas-kelas tambahan oleh guru-guru yang dilantik, serta memenuhi masa lapang dengan aktiviti-aktiviti yang membantu ke arah membina keyakinan dan jati diri untuk berjaya.

Kehadiran para pelajar di resort ini telah menarik perhatian YAB Perdana Menteri Malaysia, Tun Dr. Mahathir bin Mohamad serta isteri, Tun Dr. Siti Hasmah binti Mohd Ali, semasa lawatan beliau ke Langkawi pada 4 Julai 2018. Tun berdua telah diberi penerangan tentang program yang bertujuan untuk membantu para pelajar SK Kuala Melaka dan SK Padang Mat Sirat lulus di dalam peperiksaan. Beliau berdua turut meluangkan masa memberi nasihat kepada para pelajar untuk tekun belajar dan meyakinkan mereka bahawa ilmu pengetahuan adalah 'senjata di dalam segala perjuangan'.

Pada 29 November 2018, di hari keputusan dimaklumkan, program ini telah merekodkan peningkatan sebanyak 81.8% bagi kategori pelajar tidak bermasaalah (lulus) atau peningkatan kepada 340 dari 187 orang, di peringkat awal. Sementara itu, bilangan pelajar yang gagal telah berkang sebanyak 54.6%, atau dari 337 orang ke 184 orang. Sekolah-sekolah Alor Pongsu dan Kg. Jawa 2 pula telah berjaya mencapai sasaran di mana tiada seorang pelajar pun yang gagal di dalam semua mata pelajaran.

Dari analisa yang telah dibuat juga adalah didapati bahawa mata pelajaran Bahasa Inggeris serta Matematik adalah dua mata pelajaran yang perlukan perhatian khusus, memandangkan purata peratusan gagal adalah lebih dari 20%.

NEW POTENTIAL ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES FOR THE ABORIGINES OF THE BELUM-TEMENGOR AREA

In line with the vision of creating economic empowerment for the locals within the Pulau Banding area, both Yayasan EMKAY and Pulau Banding Foundation decided that "Gaharu" and the "Kelulut" i.e. the perfume and honey industries might be a good way to start the movement.

With that in mind, together with YBhg. Tan Sri Mustapha Kamal bin Abu Bakar, the Chairman of Yayasan EMKAY and Advisor of the Pulau Banding Foundation, the management of both foundations have organised various study trips to learn and understand the prospect of initiating these two activities in the Belum-Temengor area.

On 8th August 2018, a trip to Rompin, Pahang was organised for the team, hosted by Mr. Nazra Basir the owner of Aura Asli Enterprise and his uncle, Mr. Kamahuddin Ang. Nazra gave a briefing on his gaharu based products which he produces with the orang asli of the RPS Kedaik, Rompin area. The team was taken to the factory where chips of the 'Karas' tree (*Aquilaria malaccensis*) are chopped, soaked and boiled to produce the 'gaharu' oil, the base used in making perfumes and other products.

To further understand on how to source for the raw material (to produce the 'gaharu'), Pulau Banding Foundation (PBF) then organised a trip to a 'gaharu' farm, RAL Plantations in Kuala Kangsar, Perak. There, the team was briefed on the planting of the 'karas' trees and the process of inoculation, as well as the harvesting of the 'gaharu' and production of other products from the tree, e.g. Tea from the 'karas' leaves. PBF then, planned to inoculate the existing Karas trees within its Research Centre compound in Pulau Banding which are about

8 years old as a start. PBF, on its own too has started a Gaharu Farm on Pulau Banding, planting close to 1500 of these karas trees.

The team, on the 9th of September 2018 also visited the Kelulut Honey farm located in Felda Ijok in Selama, Perak. There, the team learnt that the community, in collaboration with the Community Innovation Centre of Universiti Sains Malaysia has developed a sustainable model for producing honey. Through its Knowledge Transfer Program, the experts from USM provided the villages with the technological know-how in terms of constructing a lasting bee hives, transferring of the bee colony, honey collection, processing of honey as well as the sales and marketing of the products.

In a meeting held at Belum Rainforest Resort on the 2nd of September 2018 with the representatives of the local community and the village headsman, it was made known that the Orang Asal are already very well involved in both gaharu and honey collection from the wild. They admitted that their traditional way of doing things might have a negative impact on the forest and their environment. Therefore, they are very much interested to learn on how to continue these activities sustainably as these activities might be a source of stable income for them in the long run.

Due to the limited knowledge and resources between the two foundations, both foundations hope that other agencies with knowledge and expertise in these two areas would come forward to assist the Orang Asal in developing these very interesting industries.

KAMPUNG SEMELOR, TEMENGOR, GERIK, PERAK DARUL RIDZUAN RECEIVES ATTENTION

Following the vision of their leader or Tok Batin, the community of Kampung Semelor has welcomed the presence of Yayasan EMKAY to run programmes in the village since 2008. Penghulu Samad, who answers affectionately to the name 'Pak Samad', is always coming up with different ways and ideas on how external agencies or groups can assist him in the development of the Kg. Semelor community.

Starting with the establishment of the '*i-play*' Toy Library (PPip) in 2008, to the development of skills training workshop in 2014, Kg. Semelor today is proud of the many facilities that attract the attention of many parties – whether for the purpose of extending assistance, learning from community development programmes, or for tourism purposes while having a unique experience - learning about the everyday life of this Temiar society.

For the second half of 2018, with the cooperation of the local community and volunteers, Yayasan EMKAY has organized various programmes at Kg. Semelor.

The first Belum Forest Friends (BFF) Programme on 10th July 2018 saw an entourage of, among others, celebrities like Jaclyn Victor, Vince Chong, Faizal Ismail (FBI), Hafiz Hamidon and Datuk Yasmin Yusof and local media visiting Kg. Semelor to participate in the effort to preserve and protect the Belum-Temengor flora and fauna. BFF focuses on the cultivation of the karas tree and sponsors school uniforms for school-going children of the Belum-Temengor region. The village community was excited by the presence of the celebrities and came out to get to know their favorite artists in person.

Kg. Semelor also received the honour of a visit by the Menteri Besar of Perak Darul Ridzuan, YAB Dato' Seri Ahmad Faizal Azumu, his wife and entourage. A festive welcome was given to the honorable Chief Minister, complete with the traditional 'headgear' and 'bodysling' by Penghulu Samad. They were also celebrated with bamboo strapping music and singing (*sewang* dance) as soon as they set foot in the village.

In addition to a briefing on the various community development programmes organized by Yayasan EMKAY, the Chief Minister also launched the new *i-play* Toy Library building, which was completed in April 2018, replacing the old building which was on loan by the Orang Asli Development Department.

Members of the Perak Economic Advisory Council also visited the village on 30th September 2018 to experience for themselves the developmental impact on the local community here. They expressed support for Yayasan EMKAY's efforts in helping the community to be independent by introducing programmes that strongly encourages community sustainability.

The second group of Belum Forest Friends (BFF) also visited Kg. Semelor when it was informed about the uniqueness of the programme when members registered as BFFs. The group spent the Deepavali holiday (6th November 2018) at Kg. Semelor! Among those present, Malaysia's bowling athlete Shalin Zulkifli, "fell in love" with this programme, which influenced her to organize a 'charity auction' to raise funds for the sponsoring of school uniforms for Belum-Temengor's students.

Kg Semelor was also visited by members of the National Education Policy Studies Committee (Jawatankuasa Kajian Dasar Pendidikan Negara) to view the Yayasan EMKAY's educational programme model, on 20th December 2018. Led by Prof. Dr. Juli Edo and Prof. Dr. Madeline Berma, the committee offered ideas to further reinforce the on-going programme at the Toy Library.

The closing of the curtain for 2018 saw Kg Semelor hosting the Mercedes Benz Malaysia Group, who has expressed a keen interest to run charity work in the Belum-Temengor area. They also held a gotong-royong at the Wawasan Gemilang Dormitory of Sekolah Kebangsaan RPS Banun.

Each group of people who have visited this village can see for themselves the progress of the children at the Toy Library, who are more confident of themselves and are not fearful (though still shy) to entertain the visitors with their singing and dance performances. Similarly, the trainees in the sewing workshop (shyly) show their artworks and traditional handicrafts while convincing the guests to buy the exhibited products.

The most enjoyed experience of ALL the groups thus far is the traditionally cooked lunch by the local community. Rice, chicken and fish, cooked in the bamboo, with *lerek* leaves used as a wrap for its scent, makes a very appealing lunch.

The success of Kg. Semelor has indeed attracted the attention of visitors which is further facilitated by the availability of chalet units for rent to anyone who wants to experience the starry night of the rainforest as well as the cool morning breeze – tranquility like no other experience can offer.

Yayasan EMKAY is proud of the pure innate desire of the people of Kg. Semelor who want to see to the development of their own community and village. This is especially commendable seeing that the slow but steady development of this village is taking place under constraints of all forms, the most important one being infrastructure i.e. road facilities. What is more important is that the presence of visitors to this village is opening up economic opportunities for this local community through product sales, promotion of their cuisine, traditional games and activities of the indigenous people, as well as ecotourism activities through rental of their chalets.

KAMPUNG SEMELOR, TEMENGOR, GERIK, PERAK DARUL RIDZUAN MENDAPAT PERHATIAN

Berpasaskan kepada wawasan Ketuanya, masyarakat Kampung Semelor telah menerima baik kehadiran Yayasan EMKAY untuk berprogram di kampung tersebut sejak tahun 2008 lagi. Penghulu Samad, yang lebih mesra dengan panggilan Pak Samad, sentiasa memberi cadangan tentang cara mana agensi luar boleh membantu beliau dalam membangunkan masyarakat Kg. Semelor.

Bermula dengan penubuhan Perpustakaan Permainan 'i-play' (PPip) pada tahun 2008, hingga ke pembangunan woksyop latihan kemahiran pada tahun 2014, Kg Semelor hari ini berbangga dengan pelbagai kemudahan yang menarik perhatian banyak pihak, samada untuk tujuan menghulurkan bantuan, belajar dari program pembangunan komuniti, mahupun untuk beriadah sambil mendapat satu pengalaman unik, mempelajari tentang kehidupan sehari-hari masyarakat Temiar ini.

Bagi separuh tahun kedua 2018 ini, dengan kerjasama masyarakat setempat dan sukarelawan, Yayasan EMKAY telah menganjurkan pelbagai program di Kg. Semelor. Rombongan Belum Forest Friends (BFF) yang pertama, yang antara lain dianggotai oleh artis-artis serta wakil media tempatan seperti Jaclyn Victor, Vince Chong, Faizal Ismail (FBI), Hafiz Hamidon and Datuk Yasmin Yusof telah mengadakan sesi lawatan ke Kg. Semelor pada 10 Julai 2018. BFF, satu program yang ditubuhkan sebagai wadah untuk 'public figures' turut serta di dalam usaha-usaha pemeliharaan dan perlindungan flora dan fauna Belum-Temengor, memberi tumpuan kepada penanaman pokok karas dan penajaan pakaian seragam sekolah untuk para pelajar orang asal Belum-Temengor. Kehadiran mereka sesungguhnya mengujakan masyarakat kampung, yang keluar beramai-ramai untuk mengenali artis-artis kesayangan mereka ini dengan lebih rapat.

Pada 2 Ogos 2018 pula, Kg. Semelor menerima kunjungan YAB Menteri Besar Perak Darul Ridzuan, Dato' Seri Ahmad Faizal Azumu beserta isteri dan rombongan. Sambutan meriah diberikan kepada YAB Menteri Besar, dengan kalungan selimpang dan tengkolok tradisional oleh Penghulu Samad. Mereka juga diraikan dengan alunan muzik ketukan buluh serta nyanyian (untuk tarian sewang) sebaik menjekakkan kaki ke kampung tersebut.

Di samping diberi taklimat tentang program pembangunan masyarakat anjuran Yayasan EMKAY, YAB Menteri Besar juga turut merasmikan bangunan PPip yang baharu, yang telah dilengkappkan pembangunannya pada bulan April 2018, menggantikan bangunan lama yang dipinjamkan oleh pihak Jabatan Kemajuan Orang Asli.

Ahli-Ahli Anggota Majlis Penasihat Ekonomi Negeri Perak juga turut mengadakan lawatan ke kampung ini untuk melihat sendiri impak pembangunan terhadap ahli masyarakat tempatan pada 30 September 2018. Mereka menyuarakan sokongan terhadap usaha Yayasan EMKAY di dalam membantu masyarakat ini untuk berdikari dengan memperkenalkan satu program yang menjamin kelestarian masyarakat.

Sebagai penutup tirai tahun 2018, Kg Semelor menjadi hos kepada sekumpulan pelawat dari Kumpulan Mercedes Benz Malaysia, yang berminat untuk menjalakan kerja-kerja amal di kawasan Belum-Temengor. Mereka turut mengadakan gotong royong di Dormitori Wawasan Gemilang, Sekolah Kebangsaan RPS Banun.

Setiap kumpulan tetamu yang hadir ke kampung ini dapat melihat sendiri perkembangan anak-anak di PPip, yang mula yakin dan berani untuk menghiburkan para pelawat dengan persebahanan nyanyian dan tarian. Yayasan EMKAY amat menyanjungi hasrat murni, yang disokong dengan usaha, penduduk Kg. Semelor di dalam membangunkan masyarakat dan kampung mereka sendiri. Istimewanya, pembangunan di kampung ini berlaku di dalam keadaan kekangan dalam segala bentuk, terutamanya infrastruktur kemudahan jalan. Apa yang lebih utama ialah dengan adanya kehadiran para pelawat ke kampung ini, ianya membuka peluang ekonomi kepada masyarakat tempatan, melalui penjualan produk, promosi masakan, permainan dan aktiviti tradisional orang asal, di samping kegiatan pelancongan melalui sewaan chalet.

BRAINS 2018 Belum Rainforest Summit

BRainS 2018 BELUM RAINFOREST SUMMIT

For the second time, Pulau Banding Foundation (PBF) in collaboration with the Perak State Government, Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM), World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) Malaysia and the Malaysian Nature Society (MNS) has successfully organised the Belum Rainforest Summit 2018, or BRainS 2018 from the 18th - 21st September 2018 at the Belum Rainforest Resort, Pulau Banding, Gerik, Perak. The Summit was graced by DYAM Raja Di-Hilir Perak, Raja Iskandar Dzurkarnain Ibni Almarhum Sultan Idris A'fifullah Shah.

The main theme of BRainS 2018 was 'Forest Biodiversity and Community: A Balanced Approach for Sustainable Development'. The emphasis this year was on how to make use of the Belum-Temengor Rainforest Complex's (BTRC) resources in a sustainable manner that benefits all stakeholders while not neglecting the importance of wildlife conservation.

During the summit, five keynote speakers, 22 invited speakers and a panel discussion were deliberated within the two and half day Summit covering the sub-themes and the main theme.

The sub themes and keynote speakers:

1. Social forestry and community – Prof. Datuk Dr. Denison Jayasooria, Director of the Institute of Ethnic Studies, UKM
2. Stakeholder participation and governance – Mr. Henry Goh, President MNS
3. Forest, REDD Plus and climate change – Dr. Elizabeth Phillips, Head of Climate Change Programme, FRIM
4. Wildlife conservation – Dr. Mark Ryan, Head of Tiger Conservation, WWF-Malaysia
5. Biodiversity and ecosystem services – Prof. Dr. Awang Noor Abdul Ghani, Alumni UPM

Over 80 delegates, mainly local participants comprising of researchers, conservationists, members of local communities, official representatives from government bodies and NGOs came together to discuss pertinent issues affecting the survival and sustainable use of the BTRC.

Government agencies present during this year's Summit included the Forestry Department of Peninsular Malaysia, the Department of Wildlife and National Parks of Peninsular Malaysia (PERHILITAN) and FRIM. Joining them were research bodies such as the Institute of Ethnic Studies UKM, Institute of Climate Change UKM and other local universities. Other participating organisations include the Perak State Park Corporation (PTN), Northern Corridor Implementation Authority (NCIA), MNS, WWF-Malaysia and the Management of Ecology of Malaysian Elephants (MEME) of the University of Nottingham. The summit also received participation from the University of Copenhagen, Denmark.

This year's conference marks a new milestone for BRainS as representatives from both the local government and Federal Government of Malaysia have joined in the discussion. The end of the Summit was marked by a panel discussion with inputs from four panel members highlighting on 'Forest Biodiversity and Community: A Balanced Approach for Sustainable Development'. The four panel members are:

2. Prof. Dr. Zalina Ismail
3. Prof. Dr. Awang Noor Abdul Ghani
4. Dr. Mark Rayan

To request the law makers and implementers to enforce stricter laws, harsher punishments and penalties to those caught poaching and plundering the forest. Enforce penalty to traders of wildlife products as well as the customers who consume these products.

To strengthen relations with neighbouring countries such as Thailand, Cambodia, Vietnam and Laos, to increase border security and prevent illegal trafficking of endangered wildlife

To promote sustainable eco-tourism through building of nature friendly facilities in forest areas and to take into account the site carrying capacity with locations in the forest to ensure minimum damage to the forest areas.

To treat Orang Asli community with respect during visits to their village.

To introduce an environmental education course in the school curriculum at all levels as well as Universities to instil in all the value and importance of our natural resources and the need for their protection

UTAR CONFERENCE

An International Conference on Tropical Biodiversity 2018 was successfully held from 8 to 11 October 2018, at Tower Regency Hotel in Ipoh. The conference was jointly organized by UTAR's Centre for Biodiversity Research (CBR), South China Botanical Garden (SCBG) (Chinese Academy of Science), Bogor Agricultural University, Society for Conservation Biology, Malaysian Society of Applied Biology, Rimba Ilmu (University of Malaya), Universiti Malaysia Terengganu, University Kuala Lumpur (UniKL) MICET, The University of Nottingham Malaysian Campus, Monash University Malaysia, Yayasan Bina Lestari, and Pulau Banding Foundation.

Prof. Dr. Goh, the organizing chairperson of the Conference of UTAR, in her welcome speech expressed the importance of our biodiversity which are the building blocks that make up the biomes which results in the stability of our ecosystems. Essentially, all living things in this world coexist and interact every day. Only with the right understanding can we manage our ecosystem more sustainably. Scientific research on biodiversity is therefore critically important for us to gain fundamental knowledge that will benefit us and to ensure that the environment we live in is sustainable and perpetual.

During the Conference period, on the 9th October, 2018, from 4.00 pm to 6.00 pm, a public forum was conducted. The theme of the forum was 'Preservation of Biodiversity, A way forward for better life'. Dr. Daniel Baskaran, the Technical advisor from the Pulau Banding Foundation was invited to moderate the forum. The guest speakers for the day were Dato Seri Dr. Gathorne Gathorne-Hardy, the 5th Earl of Cranbrook, U.K.; Dr. Chan Jin Hooi, Senior Lecturer from the University of Greenwich, U.K. and Professor Dr. Ahimsa Campos-Arceiz, an Asian Megafauna conservation ecologist from the University of Nottingham Malaysia. The forum was well attended both by the Public and the conference participants. In total there were about 118-120 persons attending the forum. This included also some secondary school students from Ipoh.

The invited speakers each were given some time to expound their experiences and what they felt needs to be done to preserve our existing biodiversity. In their deliberations, the following were expounded:

What is the meaning of Biodiversity?

The number of species of plants, animals, and microorganisms, the enormous diversity of genes in these species, the different ecosystems on the planet, such as deserts, rainforests and coral reefs are all part of a biologically diverse Earth.

How is Biodiversity Important to Mankind

At least 40 per cent of the world's economy and 80 per cent of the needs of the poor are derived from our biological resources. Furthermore, the richer the diversity of life, the greater the opportunity for medical discoveries, economic development, and adaptive responses to new challenges like climate change.

Biodiversity boosts ecosystem productivity where each species, no matter how small, all have an important role to play (Eg. Healthy ecosystems can better withstand and recover from a variety of disasters).

A healthy biodiversity provides a number of natural services for everyone which is free of charge:

1. Ecosystem services, such as

- Protection of water resources
- Soils formation and protection
- Nutrient storage and recycling
- Pollution breakdown and absorption
- Contribution to climate stability
- Maintenance of ecosystems
- Recovery from unpredictable events

2. Biological resources, such as

- Food
- Medicinal resources and pharmaceutical drugs
- Wood products
- Ornamental plants
- Breeding stocks, population reservoirs
- Future resources
- Diversity in genes, species and ecosystems

3. Social benefits, such as

- Research, education and monitoring
- Recreation and tourism
- Cultural values

Other Aspects

Additionally, Dato Seri Dr Gathorne-Hardy enlightened the participants on ways of approaching policy makers, and ways to influence policy makers in order to get the message on the importance of Biodiversity Conservation out to all. Dr. Ahimsa also emphasized that megafaunas like elephant are very important to the forest as they act as farmers transferring species of trees from one part of the forest to another through their dung while other apex species like tigers play their role in providing a check and balance between flora and fauna. Dr Chan emphasized that in this new era of technology development, technology innovations can be developed to study and protect our biodiversity. He gave an example of how conservationist are using virtual reality (VR) technology to enable public to see the beauty of the Amazon forest and understand why it is important to protect these biodiversity. In a second example he said that modern technologies can be used to raise funds for Biodiversity Research (E.g. apps developed on mobile phones to raise funds through the process of crowd-funding)

The Q&A session also led to interesting discussions on matters, such as management of resources; the need for improving quality of life and managing human consumption; and education method to encourage participants from the younger generation in conservation efforts.

WORKSHOP FOR NATURE GUIDES IN TASIK TEMENGOR

A workshop for the Nature Guides within the Belum-Temengor area was organised by Pulau Banding Foundation (PBF) in collaboration with the Perak State Park Corporation (PSPC) and Temengor Lake Tourism Entrepreneur Association (Persatuan Pengusaha Pelancongan Tasik Temengor - PPPTT). It was a joint decision by the stakeholders back in 2017, for purposes of producing a group of qualified guides in the Belum-Temengor area. This workshop was first known as the Belum Green Badge, and later was changed to 'Bengkel Pemantapan Ilmu Pemandu Pelancong Tasik Temengor'.

The most recent course was held from the 2nd to the 24th of October, conducted at the Belum Discovery Centre's gallery. For four (4) consecutive weeks, the participants took two (2) days a week off their normal routine to attend this course.

A number of activities were conducted during the sessions including short talks, group discussions, individual and group presentations, case studies through video clips, activities to boost energy, self-discovery as well as role play. The lessons learned during each of the activities are described in detail, so as to enable the participants to internalise and thereon, put into practice what they have learnt in their daily work.

At the end of the workshop, participants are expected to adopt a new work culture suited for a tourist guide, improve interaction and ability to communicate with customers, develop a strong personality in line with current needs and most importantly to disseminate accurate information with regards to flora, fauna, and the ecosystem of the forest to guests, travellers and nature lovers.

A total of 32 participants took part in the workshop comprising of local tourism operators and five (5) orang asli working in various departments within the Belum Rainforest Resort. The lecturers were officers from the various departments in Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture (MOTAC), Ministry of Health, Department of Orang Asli Development, Majlis Daerah Gerik, Forestry Department, Wildlife Department, Fire and Rescue Department, Fisheries Department and instructors from PPPTT. A total of 18 invited lecturers shared their knowledge with the participants throughout the 8 days workshop.

The closing ceremony for the workshop was held on 24th October 2018, and was graced by Encik Ahmad bin Sufain, Director of MOTAC's Perak.

KARAS PLANTING PROJECT

In Malaysia, there are 5 species of *Aquilaria* that are known to produce Gaharu, a dark and oily aromatic resin. Gaharu is derived from Sanskrit times known as "aguru", a corruption of the Sanskrit word "garu" (heavy) which refers to the tendency of resinous woods to sink in water. Gaharu is an expensive, sought after, commodity especially in the Middle East and Saudi Arabia. The main use of Gaharu is for the incense, in cosmetic and medicinal applications. Today, Gaharu is one of the highly priced incense and a rare non-timber forest product (NTFP) traded in the world.

The genus *Aquilaria* is listed on CITES Appendix II, which restricts and regulates the trading of the trees or part/products derived from them. *Aquilaria* genus is classified as the least vulnerable (VU) in IUCN Red List (facing high risk of extinction in medium-term future) which is a result of aggressive and illegal harvesting of Gaharu in the wild. In Malaysia, *Aquilaria* genus known as Karas tree produces high quality Gaharu when extracted from trees in the wild.

Pulau Banding Foundation has initiated a Karas planting project in Pulau Banding. The project started in April 2018 involving a one hectare sloping land area in the northern part of Pulau Banding.

The project started with the clearance of the area which was then terraced for easier silvicultural management of the trees planted there. *Aquilaria malaccensis*, which is the most common species found in the forest of Peninsular Malaysia was used for planting in this project. Seedlings, four feet high, which approximately is about one year old have been planted in an organized fashion in the area. To date, 1,600 seedlings have been planted in the area with the first batch of 1,000 planted in May 2018 and the balance of 500 was planted in June 2018.

This Karas project is also a pilot project for research purposes. It will also become a model for the aborigines of Belum-Temengor Rainforest Complex who are interested in planting Karas trees for Gaharu production. This is part of the Pulau Banding Foundation's efforts to reduce harvesting of Gaharu from Karas trees in the wild. Additionally, the population of Karas in the wild is also declining, due to illegal harvesting of these trees by intruders into the forest.

It will take a minimum of seven years before the Karas trees are ready to be inoculated, and for them to start producing Gaharu. The inoculation technique is a process where artificial inoculants are injected into the tree to assist it to produce Gaharu. After a minimum of 16 months, the Karas tree will start producing Gaharu of various grades and may be sold as raw Gaharu wood or distilled gaharu oil.



PROJEK KOLEKSI ORKID HUTAN BELUM-TEMENGOR DI BELUM RAINFOREST RESORT

Orkid/Anggerik atau nama timangannya "Pandas of the Plant Kingdom" merupakan sejenis tumbuhan berbunga yang mempunyai habitat yang sangat luas kerana ianya boleh dijumpai sama ada di atas tanah, celahan batu atau menumpang di atas pokok lain yang sesuai dengan keperluan hidupnya. Walau bagaimanapun, habitat yang paling digemari orkid adalah kawasan lembap berhampiran sungai atau di atas pokok tinggi untuk mendapatkan cahaya matahari.

Kebenaran daripada pihak Jabatan Perhutanan Negeri dan Daerah diperlukan sebelum pengumpulan orkid dilakukan kerana ianya melibatkan hasil hutan.

kerja-kerja pengumpulan koleksi orkid dilakukan menggunakan khidmat orang asal dan penyelidik serta individu yang mempunyai pengetahuan tentang orkid di sekitar kawasan hutan Kompleks Belum-Temengor. Orkid-orkid yang dikumpul akan dikenal pasti namanya bagi memudahkan pengunjung untuk mengenali tumbuhan tersebut.

Orkid dilekatkan pada batang pokok atau ditanam semula mengikut keadaan di habitat asalnya. Sekiranya perlu, batang pokok atau medium tanaman lain akan diletak sebagai dekorasi kawasan terbabit. Penyembur kabus dipasang di beberapa lokasi bagi menyediakan persekitaran dan kelembapan yang sesuai untuk pertumbuhan orkid.

Berdasarkan beberapa penyelidikan saintifik yang telah dijalankan oleh Pulau Banding Foundation dan Jabatan Perhutanan Gerik di lokasi seperti Sungai Nam, Sungai Kejar dan Sungai Tiang, terdapat kira-kira 40 spesis orkid yang dikenalpasti hidup di dalam hutan Belum-Temengor. Walau bagaimanapun sepanjang tahun 2018 ini sahaja, projek ini telah berjaya menemui dan mengumpul hampir 45 spesis. Ada di antaranya tidak tersenarai di dalam laporan hasil penemuan ekspedisi sebelum ini! Ini mungkin kerana kawasan liputan ekspedisi adalah terhad. Ia juga menunjukkan bahawa kompleks hutan ini masih menyimpan ribuan rahsia yang belum terungkai.

Antara orkid istimewa yang diperolehi dalam projek pengumpulan ini adalah orkid harimau (*Grammatophyllum speciosum*) iaitu spesies orkid terbesar di dunia yang berasal dari Asia Tenggara. Ia tumbuh di celah-celah pokok besar di kawasan terbuka Hutan Tropika tanah rendah.

Orkid harimau boleh menghasilkan tangkai bunga yang banyak. Ada kalanya antara 20 hingga 30 tangkai yang akan menjadi tarikan utama pengunjung apabila ianya berbunga. Bunganya boleh bertahan sehingga tiga bulan. Spesies orkid harimau ini disenaraikan dalam Guinness Book of World Records sebagai orkid tertinggi di dunia dengan ketinggian 7.62 meter.

Orkid lain yang bakal menjadi perhatian ialah orkid jenis *Bulbophyllum lobbii*, *Bulbophyllum claptonense*, *Bulbophyllum liones* dan *Bulbophyllum macranthum*.

Bye bye Carlos!

CARLOS RETURNS TO THE WILDS OF SARAWAK

In the spirit of the MOU signed in year 2002, between the Bukit Merah Orang Utan Island Foundation (BMOUIF) and the Sarawak Forestry Corporation (SFC), one of the orangutans was sent back into the wild in Sarawak in October 2018. Earlier, in a ceremony witnessed by the YAB Prime Minister of Malaysia, on 6th July 2018, SFC has agreed to welcome back the Borneon Orang Utan (*Pongo pygmaeus*) and thereon, detailed arrangements have been made by both parties to send Carlos home. Carlos was sent to the Orang Utan Island Bukit Merah on 20th December 2002, one of the 9 orang utans received from the SFC.

Yes, Carlos might not need a ticket to fly, but he needs to be accorded with the respect reserved for VIPs and the most comfortable seat to go home! A series of discussions were held between SFC and BMOUIF to ensure a smooth and safe transfer of Carlos. Inputs from the experts were sought and approvals from various authorities were obtained, before the scheduled flight.

His journey started when he was transported on a truck from Bukit Merah, on 25 October 2018 to the Subang Airport. Then on to Kuching on flight TH315 which arrives at 2:30 pm on 26th October 2018.

He might be alone during the journey. But, upon arrival, he was greeted by a team of experts and a veterinary doctor from BMOUIF and SFC officials. Upon arrival in Kuching, on 27th October 2018, Carlos was transferred to the Matang Wildlife Centre.

Thereon, we learnt that he will undergo a quarantine period of 90 days, his second phase of rehabilitation, prior to being released into the forest.

Kem-kem yang telah dilaksanakan dan penilaian peserta

Sepanjang tahun 2018, sebanyak 16 kem GRM termasuk program tahunan GRM iaitu Kids Interactive Expedition (KlxE) telah dijalankan. Berdasarkan borang penilaian para peserta, peratus kepuasan tentang kem-kem yang dijalankan amatlah menggalakkan :-



KIDS INTERACTIVE EXPEDITION (KlxE) 2018

Tahun ini, program KlxE telah diadakan Bukit Merah Resort, Perak, yang menyaksikan penyertaan 25 buah sekolah dengan seramai 104 orang peserta. Program yang dibahagi kepada dua kem, Hornbill dan Pioneer telah dijalankan pada 9 hingga 12 November 2018, manakala kem untuk peserta sekolah menengah telah diadakan pada 12 hingga 15 November 2018.

Tugasan pra-kem, KSSP (KlxE School Sustainability Programme) atau dalam Bahasa Malaysianya, Program Kelestarian Sekolah KlxE telah diteruskan pada tahun ini. Tugasan ini diberikan kepada setiap kontingen sekolah sebulan sebelum tarikh ekspedisi KlxE.

Tahun ini, para peserta diberi pilihan untuk menjalankan salah satu daripada topik berikut :-

1. Cabaran 30 hari 'Zero waste'
2. Projek 'Zero waste' sekolah
3. Penggunaan tenaga (elektrik, solar, pengudaraan dan tenaga yang boleh diperbaharui)
4. Penggunaan air
5. Ecopreneurship

Objektif tugas ini adalah untuk mengajar peserta tentang kelestarian melalui perancangan, pelaksanaan dan pengkajian semula kaedah kelestarian yang digunakan di sekolah setiap hari. Peserta divajibkan untuk membentangkan projek yang telah dijalankan di sekolah masing-masing pada malam terakhir ekspedisi KlxE. Melalui tugas ini, adalah diharapkan agar setiap peserta dapat meningkatkan pengetahuan tentang konsep sisa sifar "zero waste" dan kelestarian dan dapat mempraktikkan apa yang telah dipelajari dalam kehidupan sehari-hari.

Program tahun ini turut melibatkan barisan saintis/mentor dari Universiti Sains Malaysia, yang telah berkongsi kepakaran mengikut bidang masing-masing terutama dalam perlaksanaan eksperimen.

Adalah menjadi harapan, agar GRM akan terus berkembang dan bertapak di setiap sekolah di Malaysia, agar hasrat pengasasnya, untuk mengubah minda dan sikap generasi muda agar sayangkan alam semula jadi akan tercapai.

PUGMARK SUPERCAMP

No doubt that it is hard to deny that the large creature which belongs to the cat species is an attraction to our country since a very long time. People just could not escape from giving attention to the 'king of the forest'. Often, one of the first questions from foreign guests at Belum Rainforest Resort is about 'Tiger'. This always happen from my experience at the 'Front Office' during our short briefing, informal chat or during my 'nature guiding' for trips organized by the resort.

On the 11th Oct 2018, I was lucky enough to be nominated by the resort management to participate in the annually run 'Pugmark Supercamp' in Bukit Merah Laketown Resort, Perak. Over the course of three days, we were taught of the Feline species itself, the population, habitat, demographic and their problem posed in the modern day especially with poachers and the 'human/beast' conflicts.

I especially paid great attention on the knowledge of traps and snares used to capture the big cats as well as the method to detonate the traps. The valuable knowledge could come in handy someday, perhaps when I encountered the 'lethal trap' itself. Yes, the trap is lethal; you should see some of the poor beasts at the non-publicized conservation center (National Wildlife Rescue Centre) that the organizer brought us to, in

Sungai, Perak on the last day of the course. I get to see for myself that some of the tigers that were saved have already lost their limbs due to the traps laid by poachers.

Talking about poachers, the beast that we called 'Panthera Tigris Jacksoni' is unfortunate despite their high economic value, as their high price put a great demand on the mostly illegal market. The already dwindling numbers from 250 individuals (on latest statistics) facing downward trends due to poaching and land development. Malayan Tigers are facing real threat to survive in modern days. "We can't afford to lose them", said Puan Zainon Kasim (on behalf of Yayasan Emkay), "They are the king of the forest, they are depicted as icons in our country, even a financial institution, sport teams..... Moreover, lack of tigers means the ultimate destruction of the forest as they are, whether you like it or not, part of the forest eco system, if not a major part".

For such a large beast (total length ranged from 190 to 280 cm, height ranged from 61 to 114 cm, and their body weight from 47.2 to 129.1 kg), tigers are such a vulnerable creature nowadays.

The three days course attended by various government agencies and some private bodies was very important to increase awareness among us not just about tigers but also about our environment. I hope such programme, organized by Yayasan EMKAY can be increased in frequency and numbers and be made accessible to the masses including the school children.
